## ***LOOKING BEYOND OURSELVES***

The message found in today's readings is an oft-told story. Citizen Kane, Daddy Warbucks, and King Midas are only a few of the familiar fictional characters who thought enormous wealth could buy happiness and fulfillment. Daddy Warbucks admitted stepping on a few people in his climb to the top. Kane tried to buy the printed word and stardom for his young wife, while King Midas conjured immense wealth and tragedy by his very touch.

We learn clearly in today's readings that none of this is really possible. True happiness comes from caring for someone other than ourselves. It comes from the pursuit of the virtues Paul described to Timothy: faith, love, gentleness, godliness, righteousness, and endurance. The Gospel reminds us that we dare not ignore the needs of others, acting as though we don't notice their suffering. God's call to us is much too clear to disregard for even one more day.

**Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**

For many years, the Catholic Church has been at the forefront on the issue of the sanctity of and respect for human life.

In this context, **the Diocese of Venice will conduct its first Respect Life Collection in conjunction with National Respect Life Sunday on the weekend of October 6-7.** This special second collection will support various local organizations and programs that request needed financial support from the Church.

Local Pregnancy Resource Centers throughout the Diocese help women choose life for their children. They offer the emotional and spiritual support that is often lacking and provide links to needed financial resources in the community. Maternity homes offer a safe, supportive environment when housing is an issue. After-birth homes provide support for mom and baby so a mother can continue her education to better provide for herself and her child. These programs save and improve lives, but they need funds to continue their good work. Post abortion healing programs like Project Rachel and Rachel's Vineyard help women and men heal from the emotional wounds of abortion.

**Respect for life also includes concerns at the end of earthly life and other issues.** People find themselves unable to cope with being alone and failing health. They need support and love from their parish family and community.

**By sponsoring one collection yearly, each parish will have the opportunity to contribute to organizations that support life from conception to natural death. The funds collected will remain in the Diocese of Venice and will facilitate our witness as a faith community to the value of all human life.**

**Please be generous** in your expression of respect for life during next week's second collection. Thank you for your support of this effort. May God bless you!

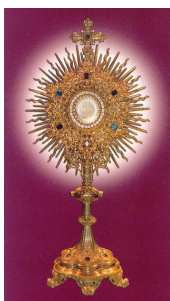

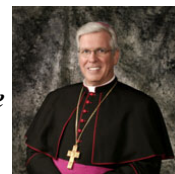

### TEST THAT CAN SAVE YOUR LIFE!

#### *Life Screening*

**Life Line Screening** is a preventive healthcare ultrasound screening which will be held in the **Parish Center on Thurs., Oct. 11.** Life Line Screening will scan the carotid artery in the neck for plaque build up, the arteries in the legs for Peripheral Arterial Disease, test for aneurysms in the aortic vessel in the abdomen, and a bone density screening for women and men to test for risk of Osteoporosis. This is a prevention program, and with early detection, these problems can be treated. The results are sent directly to you and Life Line Screening encourages you to take them back to your primary care physician. These tests are non-invasive and completely painless and take about ten minutes or less each.

They also offer 2 simple finger-stick blood tests to identify risk factors for heart disease and diabetes! The 2 tests are: Complete Lipid Panel - measures total cholesterol, HDL, LDL, triglycerides and glucose (blood sugar for diabetes). Participants receive results at screening!

Blood test package price: \$60; Vascular package price: \$119; Vascular with Blood tests: \$169; Complete Wellness Package, all 4 tests: \$129; Complete Wellness with Blood tests: \$179.
